In 1998, CFUW-Calgary undertook *My Very Own Book Project* to provide less fortunate children with books they can own. The Club has raised more than \$10,000 and from 2001 - 2010, presented the Calgary Urban Project Society's (CUPS) One World Child Development Centre with over 800 books and other learning materials.

Since 2008, CFUW-Calgary has also donated \$500 to fund 25 children's individual book bags through the *Welcome to Kindergarten Program*.

In 2011, **Calgary Reads** became the continuing recipient of MVOBP donations. Since then, CFUW-Calgary has raised over \$12,000 for Calgary Reads.

SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

CFUW/Calgary has a long-standing history of funding scholarships and bursaries at the University of Calgary and Mount Royal University. Each year the donations and proceeds from the Scholarship activities aid in supporting the scholarships. The club operates a charitable trust, registered with the Canada Revenue Agency and issues tax-deductible receipts.

CFUW/Calgary members have approved motions to endow scholarships and bursaries at the University of Calgary. As each award is endowed, the University manages the investments and grants the awards to students according to the terms of the endowment agreement with CFUW/Calgary.
